For most of my life, I have been encouraged by the gift of meaningful coincidence. For example, shortly after I become aware of a referral resource, someone calls who needs that exact information. An experience like this multiplied many times assures me that we are being supported by unseen presences and gives me heart for the inevitable difficulties.

Despite worrisome financial news, people seem to be motivated less by fear and more by intentional discernment. The global economic crisis has put our own challenges into perspective causing more people to emphasize kindness.

Whenever we create a new Paper Intervention™ brochure the process involves feedback from members of the community, school personnel, parents and young people. Their eagerness to help has greatly enhanced new titles published this year, which include, "Finding Balance as a Caregiver", "Are You Playing Financial Roulette?" and "Striking a Wise Academic Balance".

Our loyal and hardworking staff and Board of Directors for the past 36 years gives me hope.

***You** give us hope. When financial times are tough for so many of us, you, our supporters, give more, recognizing that the people who need help are growing in number. We work with families dealing with foreclosure, addiction, unemployment, bankruptcy, no access to health insurance, untreated mental illness and poverty. They come looking for help and we can give it because of you.*

"My friends and family know me as a cynic, but one recent event, with its hope-filled message, easily broke through the façade.

This past April, a 6.3 earthquake ravaged more than twenty villages in central Italy, a mountainous region where righteous Christians once risked their lives by sheltering Jewish families fleeing from the anti-Semitic surge of second world war Europe. Within a week of the quake, a delegation of elderly Italian Jews and their descendants, as well as Jewish community leaders, roamed the shattered countryside, looking for the families of their one-time saviors, now living in tent camps. They offered everything from shoes to summer camp subsidies. "I wouldn't be here if it weren't for these people," was the collective inspiration for the volunteer relief workers.

For over fifty years, the Jewish mantra "we must never forget" has referred to the atrocities of the holocaust and echoed the need for eternal vigilance lest history attempt to repeat. What is remarkable is that this group of Italian Jews has never forgotten those who helped them survive that time, both individually and collectively. This surfacing of sixty-year old buried memories, this expression of heartfelt appreciation, transcends the experience of these two specific groups of people — there is, of course, a universal lesson at work, one that indeed gives me hope."

We have accomplished much since we embarked on our goal of educating the community about the causes of and some solutions to the issue of girl on girl aggression. In the past few years we have:

- Convened monthly meetings for community members to work on this issue
- Invited speakers such as Child Advocate Jeanne Milstein and State Rep Andrew Fleischmann to educate the wider community
- Researched trends and attitudes in West Hartford on this issue in partnership with St Joseph College
- Convened a Community Conversation attended by over 100 people
- Produced a four part television series of WHC-TV on the topic as it relates to preschool, elementary school, middle and high school

- Created four Paper Intervention™ brochures for care providers and parents that make clear when preschool, elementary school, middle and high school girls are engaging in relational cruelty and what the age-appropriate interventions are. - Provided multiple Communologue training sessions to interested community members as a means to help others gain communication and listening skills
- Provided a day-long training to staff at Bristow Middle School on Communologue for advisors to use with advisee groups
